**ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES HONORED
VOLUNTEERS IN CEREMONY AT STATE FAIR**

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources honored 8 individuals and 3 groups as Outstanding Volunteers of the Year during a ceremony in Conservation World at the Illinois State Fair.

“Our volunteers are doing great work by helping at state parks, and with our other programs, such as nature preserve restoration, the urban fishing program, and safety education just to name a few. This recognition program is one way we can thank them for the valuable service and expertise they provide to us and to the people of the State of Illinois,” said IDNR Director Marc Miller.

The volunteer recognition awards ceremony took place Saturday, August 21st at the Illinois Green Industry Association Outdoor Amphitheater, on the Illinois State Fairgrounds. One of this year’s honorees is the **Illinois Archery Association**.

In 2003 the IDNR signed on as the eighth state in the nation to coordinate and offer the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP), a groundbreaking archery education program through the school system. The program offers an opportunity for school-aged youth to gain peer recognition while learning the concepts of leadership, sportsmanship and mental focus. The IDNR has now trained teachers in more than 140 schools across the state in the National Archery in the Schools Program. In 2006 plans were made to host the first-ever state NASP Tournament to schools offering the program. This tournament also serves as the qualifying tournament for teams wishing to go on to the national championships. The Illinois Archery Association immediately offered its assistance and expertise in staging and managing the tournament. For the last five years, the association has provided member manpower to referee, handle scoring data input and operation, and manage equipment such as targets, bow stands, and netting to ensure a safe and tournament-friendly range. The association has also provided trophies for the division winners and secured bows and arrows from its member clubs to use as prizes. The IDNR appreciates everything the Illinois Archery Association has done to support its Archery in the Schools Program.

IAA Fund Raiser

At the convention this year, we were discussing things the IAA could do if we had more money and the idea for a fund raiser was discussed. The IAA Board realizes our organization could raise quite a bit of money through this fund raiser and the funds could be used for betterment of the organization. We also realize we stand to lose money if the membership is not on board with it and willing to help make it work. I have been involved with identical fund raisers and here is how it works.

It is a gun of the month raffle where we give away 1 gun each month for a year. Each raffle ticket is in the drawing each month whether it was previously drawn out as a winner or not. This means each ticket purchased is in 12 gun raffles and the owner of that ticket has the potential of winning all 12 guns since each winning ticket goes back into the bucket of tickets. The tickets are easy to sell because for \$15 the purchaser is in 12 gun raffles.

Here is an example of how it works in more detail:

IAA gets with FFL dealer and decides which guns will be given each month.

IAA has tickets printed up with the gun for each month listed on back.

Each Head of House Hold receives minimum of 5 tickets to sell for \$15 each. More tickets are available upon request. All tickets are sold over a period of 2-3 months. You turn in your tickets stubs and money(write check to IAA for money collected).

IAA buys 12 guns for average cost of \$500 - total cost of guns \$6,000. We have an FFL dealer who will buy and sell to us at his cost.

Then a winner is drawn each month for twelve months.

As incentive to sell tickets, you get your name in a different pot once for each 5 tickets you sell. We will give \$500 to one IAA member whose name is drawn.

Estimated minimum funds to be raised (based on a minimum of 5 tickets sold per house and an average cost of \$500 per gun):

217 Head of House Hold X 5 tickets X \$15 = \$16,275

Subtract cost of guns - \$6,000 leaves \$10,275

Subtract cost of printing the tickets - ~\$100 leaves \$10,175

Subtract postage to mail tickets to members - ~\$150 leaves \$10,025

Subtract incentive paid to one IAA member - \$500 leaves \$9,525 for IAA use. This is the minimum we would raise since you can sell more than 5 tickets.

Gun raffle tickets are very easy to sell. The first year I participated in this type raffle I sold 105 tickets. The more you sell the more we make. Our organization could make a lot of improvements and do some new things with the money raised through this fund raiser. Please let your IAA Board representatives know your thoughts on this fund raiser.

The IAA Board of Directors meeting was held August 28, 2010 at the Joliet Archery Range following the field championship. The meeting was called to order at 3:35 PM by the NFAA Councilman, Bob McCutcheon

Roll call of officers was taken with the following present, NFAA Director, Judy McCutcheon; northern board, Rick Knorr, Walter Erickson and Bill Berger; central board Bill Mohn; southern board, Bill Schuh and Ron Whitlock.

The minutes of the last meeting was passed out in advance and Ron Whitlock made a motion, 2nd by Rick Knorr to accept as published. The financial reports were discussed and Walter Erickson made a motion, 2nd by Bill Schuh to accept as printed.

A discussion was held on the vacancy of a central board member and Bob McCutcheon will ask Kathy Pindell to accept this position.

Bill Schuh presented each board member with a copy of proposal for a gun raffle as a fund raiser. They also noted that on the big game awards they have done away with the Pope & Young scoring. The youth committee reported that they had a good turn out at Glisson Archery. Bill Berger reported that he teaches classes at Glisson Archery and Joliet Archery also has classes. Bill Mohn reported that he has been working with the 4 H groups. The membership & Club retention committee reported that Bill Mohn has been working with 4 H groups and suggested that member become instructors.

Bob McCutcheon reported that Illinois Department of Natural Resources honored the Illinois Archery Association as the "Outstanding Volunteers of the Year", this year during the state fair.

Bill Berger requested information on life membership. He will send in his requested in writing.

The next board of Directors meeting will be held November 7, 2010 at Prairie Archery.

Ron Whitlock made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Rick Knorr. The meeting adjourned at 4:50PM.
