To make this year's gun raffle a success, we will need every member's help. The proceeds from the raffles enabled the IAA to function for the last few years. It's what we used to purchase the State Championship trophies which cost the IAA approximately \$2000.00 for the previous years. This cost previously was taken from the entry fees of each tournament before the club/IAA split. Aggregate trophies are paid for solely by the State Organization. Throughout the year, we have additional expenses. The only other income we get each year is from the State dues and the small percentage we get from the State Shoots each year. Without the previous gun raffle, the IAA could have been out of money and unable to continue. So please take a few minutes and think about this, then get with either Bill Mohn or Sara Rayhel and have them send some tickets to you. We need your help.

The IAA Board of Directors and the members that were present at the convention in March decided to hold another Gun Raffle to raise money for the organization. This will enable the organization to do more things to promote itself and the sport that we all love. Ticket Prices are \$20.00 each and tickets are on sale. First drawing will be in January of 2017. We have to sell 600 tickets before the drawings will start. If we do not sell at least 600 tickets, it will become a 50/50 drawing. Guns will not be purchased until after each drawing. Winner may want cash instead of the gun for that month. If the winner chooses the gun, there may be a delay in delivery of the gun due to some shortages from manufacturers, according to the firearms dealer we are working with. Only 2000 tickets will be printed which will increase the odds of winning. Drawn ticket will go back into the bucket for the next drawing so 1 person has the potential to win all 12 guns for an investment of \$20.00. Bill Mohn and Bill Schuh again graciously agreed to administer the raffle for the IAA. Club contacts or members contact Bill Mohn for tickets. Club contact will distribute tickets to club members. They know the members and can better control tickets and money. Club contact will collect the ticket stubs and \$\$ or checks. Please make checks payable to IAA for amount collected. Seller puts their name on the back of the ticket stub that they sell. For every 10 tickets that you sell, seller gets one free. Each member needs to turn in their sold ticket stubs by the 15th of the month for the next month's drawing. Tickets can be sold to non-Illinois residents. IL residents will require a FOID card to accept a gun. Non IL residents will need to make delivery arrangements with their local FFL gun dealer to receive any guns won. IAA Raffle Ticket Selling Tips

1. Contact your local club raffle contact or Bill Mohn at 217-725-0836 to obtain tickets to sell.
2. The tickets cost \$20.00
3. Ask friends, family and co-workers if they like guns and gun raffles. If they say "no", then ask them if they like cash. There is a cash option for each raffle if they don't want a gun. Show them the back of the tickets for the list of guns and cash options.
4. Explain that these tickets are for 12 raffles at about \$1.67 per raffle. The winning tickets go back in the cage for the next drawing so all tickets are in all 12 raffles.
5. Have the buyer fill out the left portion of ticket so we can contact them. Tear of the right portion of ticket and give to the buyer so they can see what is being given away each month.
6. Be sure to put your name on the back of the ticket stub as IAA member. For every 10 tickets you sell, you get 1 ticket free.
7. Mail ticket stubs and a check for the total sold to Bill Mohn. Make checks payable to IAA or Illinois Archery Association.

Notes: Some people may ask how they get their gun if they live out of state. If people live out of state or don't want to pick up their gun at our dealer in Springfield, IL, they can have the gun shipped from our dealer to an FFL gun dealer near them. Then they can pick up their gun at their local dealer. Some people may ask if they need a FOID to buy tickets. They do not need a FOID to buy tickets. If they are a winner and live in Illinois and want a gun instead of cash, then they will need a FOID. Out of state winners do not need a FOID.

A. Any other type of Big Game Animal NOT commonly found in the territorial boundaries of the United States, but declared Big Game on an INTERNATIONAL LEVEL will be considered for an award, providing that such Big Game was taken legally and is not on the ENDANGERED SPECIES LIST of the U.S.

Government, and that the PELT of said animal can legally be brought into this country.

B. That the governing body of this Association will have the right to disqualify any such animal that does not meet the requirements listed in Paragraph A

C. That all Big Game animals submitted for an award be submitted with substantial proof of the kill:

1. That a picture of the animal and the signature of witness, warden, forest ranger, conservation officer or police officer be present on all applications.
2. If for any reason Paragraph C, Item 1 cannot be complied with, a letter of explanation must accompany all applications giving full details and circumstances as to why.
3. If you hunted with a reputable and licensed guide, a letter of acknowledgment of the taking of any Big Game will be accepted in place of the above mentioned signatures.

D. A PICTURE MUST ACCOMPANY ALL APPLICATIONS.

BOWHUNTING FAIR CHASE RULES DEFINED:

Any animal taken under any of the following circumstances shall not be considered for any award: "YARDED" IN DEEP SNOW, HELPLESS IN WATER, HELPLESS ON ICE, HELPLESS IN TRAP, WHILE CONFINED BEHIND FENCES AS ON GAME FARMS, ETC., IN DEFIANCE OF GAME LAWS OR OUT OF SEASON. No animal shall be taken by "Jack Lighting"- shining at night from a power vehicle or power boat. Any other method considered by the N.F.A.A. or I.A.A. Bowhunting Committee to be UNSPORTSMANLIKE

Convention Minutes November, 2016

The sixty-third IAA convention was held November 6, 2016 at the Route 66 Convention Center in Springfield.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Robert Rayhel at 10:03 A.M. 23 members attended. After the pledge of allegiance, roll call of officers was taken with the following present; Chairman, Robert Rayhel; NFAA Director, Judy McCutcheon-Adams; northern board, Rick Knorr, Randy Rutledge; central board, Don Craig, Roger Nieders, and Kathy Pindell; southern board Craig Olson, Ron Whitlock, and Tim Eller. There were 12 delegates in attendance: Dixie Garner, Bill Mohn, Jeanne Mohn, Mike Flier, Eddie Flier, Jamie Young, Rick Adams, Rhonda Eller, Norm Lauer, Cassie Flood, Bob Wolfram, and Christina Wolfram. Dana Janeic and family and Savanna Crowley and Marci Klobberdanz attended the luncheon and awards presentation.

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed to the board members in advance and Tim Eller made a motion, 2nd by Ron Whitlock to accept as published. Motion carried.

The financial statements were accepted as published by a motion from Tim Eller, 2nd by Jeanne Mohn after comparison to Oct. 2015 balance. Motion carried.

NFAA Director, Judy McCutcheon-Adams reported the NFAA board of directors meeting will be held July 31-Aug. 1 in Yankton and will include the election for NFAA president and vice-president. Brian Sheffler is running unopposed for president while there are two candidates, Ray Jones and Doug Joyce for VP. Agenda items are due April 1 and will be available to be viewed on the NFAA and IAA websites. Contact Judy with any input or questions.

Judy also stated that last June at the council meeting, a membership drive strategy was presented which partnered with QCSS to contact former NFAA members. The plan was implemented earlier than expected, before the directors were notified, and some former members feared a scam, but a call from QCSS is in conjunction with the NFAA and is legitimate. So far, 60 former members have rejoined.

The next convention date was discussed. Members like the Nov. date which allows shoot dates to be set early and avoids winter travel conditions. A motion to have the convention in Nov., 2017 was made by Tim Eller, 2nd by Ron Whitlock. Motion carried.

Constitution committee, RIC, and Membership and Club Retention committees had no new reports. Bowhunting and Conservation- Ron Whitlock reported no hunt teams had registered. Youth committee- Robert Rayhel said he was notified the NASP state shoot will be held March 24-25, 2017 in Springfield. Due to a change in lane width requirements, participants from some schools will shoot on Friday.

Awards- Cost for current plaques was kept under \$35 by using remaining supply. The plaque style was shown which will be given for the 2017 tournaments.

US Collegiate will be part of NFAA/IAA. These college students will be shooting at Vegas and Nationals.

NFAA/IAA representatives were invited to the Kroc center in Chicago to give a presentation. The directors of the complex are interested in starting an archery program for their youth.

Secretary report- Dues remain the same with NFAA/IAA club charter \$50 total, commercial range \$100, head of household individual \$60, additional person \$7, 2nd additional \$7, 3rd additional \$2. Youth only membership is \$20 total. When completing club charter application, membership is 5 head of household using expiration date of membership. Some members are having trouble viewing their newsletter. If you are not seeing a current newsletter, try refreshing the IAA webpage.

Old business- Bill Mohn reported no one had turned in raffle tickets.

No new business.

Tournament committee accepted bids for shoots. The locations and dates are listed in the coming events.

The next Board meetings will be March 26, 2017 in Springfield, on July 9, 2017 at the State Target in Pekin, and Nov. 5, 2017 at the convention.

Shooter of the Year 2016 silver belt buckles were presented to Kathy Pindell and Robert Wolfram.

After lunch break, Bill Mohn introduced the 4-H archers who qualified to compete at nationals.

The state championship and indoor aggregate awards were presented.

The meeting adjourned at 2:15 P.M.

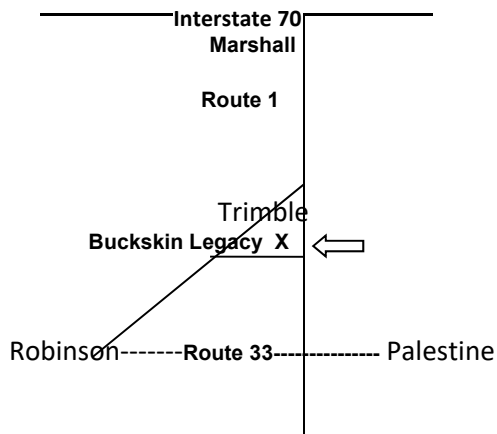

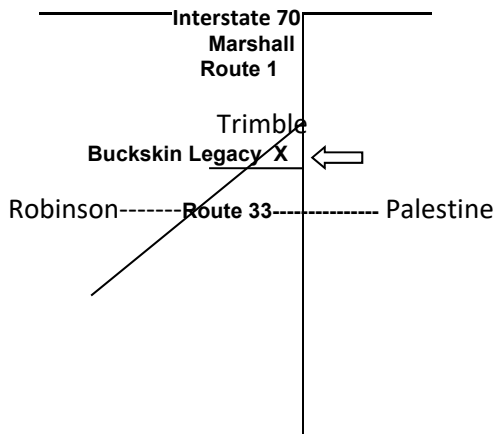
