Written bids for State Indoor Championship 2021 need to be submitted to IAA Secretary by July 1, 2020. All upcoming shoots and dates are listed in the Coming Events.

Board of Directors Meeting

The IAA Board of Directors meeting was held Nov. 3, 2019 at Golden Corral in Springfield. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Tim Eller at 10:06 A.M. Pledge of allegiance was led by Tim Eller. Roll call of officers and delegates was taken with the following present; NFAA Director, Robert Rayhel; Chairman, Tim Eller; Northern board, Rick Knorr, Randy Rutledge, and Cassie Flood; Central board, Don Craig and Kathy Pindell; Southern board Judy McCutcheon-Adams, Ron Whitlock, and Patrick Eller. Roger Nieders was absent. Others attending were Neal Hause, Dan, Christi, & Dusti Batsch, Rick Adams, and Jerry & Sharon Trame. Roll call of delegates was taken with the following clubs represented: Buckskin, Havana, Joliet, Kishwaukee, Panther Creek, Pekin, Sauk Valley, and Wolf Run.

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed to the board members in advance. Ron Whitlock made a motion, 2nd by Judy McCutcheon-Adams to accept. Motion carried.

The financial statements were accepted by a motion from Randy Rutledge, 2nd by Rick Knorr. Motion carried.

Director Robert Rayhel reported he had received the new Constitution from NFAA. A one year free membership to NFAA is being offered to youth who are affiliated with another organization such as JOAD, S3DA, NASP, 4-H, etc. and have not been a member of NFAA.

Constitution committee, RIC, and Membership/Club Retention committees had no new reports. Bowhunting and Conservation- Ron Whitlock reported two hunt teams had registered. The deadline is the last day of archery deer season and registration of \$10 per team member should be sent to IAA secretary.

Randy Rutledge brought samples of award medals. Instead of presenting a plaque at the convention, medals could be given at the conclusion of each State Championship. Don Craig had also looked at a different style of plaque, but the source of the award was no longer available. Awards committee will continue investigating a supplier for medals.

Youth committee- Robert Rayhel said the state NASP tournament will be March 27-28 in Springfield.

Randy Rutledge suggested the hosting club should run the entire State Championship tournament including online registration. After discussion it was voted on by a motion by Don Craig, 2nd by Kathy Pindell, that Sauk Valley would be responsible for the State Indoor Championship this year on a trial basis. It is optional for other clubs holding State Championships if they want to run the shoot or have the organization handle it.

Committee appointments were reviewed by Chairman Tim Eller.

Secretary reported on how to fill out a membership form for the free year NFAA membership for the youth who are affiliated with another organization.

A discussion was held on the changes to the Field-Hunter-Animal rounds at the Outdoor Sectionals and National Field. Director, Robert Rayhel, asked that the club that will be hosting State Field try the new format so shooters could give comments and suggestions to him.

The tournament committee accepted clubs for the following shoots: State Outdoor Target bid by Buckskin Legacy and State Field Championship at Joliet. Bids were accepted for the Indoor 2021 aggregates with the Northern zone at Joliet, Central zone at Havana, and Southern zone at Buckskin Legacy.

The next Board meeting will be July 12th at Scheels beginning at 1 P.M.

Awards were presented and a motion was made to adjourn by Ron Whitlock, 2nd by Patrick Eller. Meeting adjourned for lunch at 11:51 AM.

A. Any other type of Big Game Animal NOT commonly found in the territorial boundaries of the United States, but declared Big Game on an INTERNATIONAL LEVEL will be considered for an award, providing that such Big Game was taken legally and is not on the ENDANGERED SPECIES LIST of the U.S. Government, and that the PELT of said animal can legally be brought into this country.

B. That the governing body of this Association will have the right to disqualify any such animal that does not meet the requirements listed in Paragraph A

C. That all Big Game animals submitted for an award be submitted with substantial proof of the kill:

1. That a picture of the animal and the signature of witness, warden, forest ranger, conservation officer or police officer be present on all applications.

2. If for any reason Paragraph C, Item 1 cannot be complied with, a letter of explanation must accompany all applications giving full details and circumstances as to why.

3. If you hunted with a reputable and licensed guide, a letter of acknowledgment of the taking of any Big Game will be accepted in place of the above mentioned signatures.

D. A PICTURE MUST ACCOMPANY ALL APPLICATIONS.

BOWHUNTING FAIR CHASE RULES DEFINED:

Any animal taken under any of the following circumstances shall not be considered for any award: "YARDED" IN DEEP SNOW, HELPLESS IN WATER, HELPLESS ON ICE, HELPLESS IN TRAP, WHILE CONFINED BEHIND FENCES AS ON GAME FARMS, ETC., IN DEFIANCE OF GAME LAWS OR OUT OF SEASON. No animal shall be taken by "Jack Lighting"- shining at night from a power vehicle or power boat. Any other method considered by the N.F.A.A. or I.A.A. Bowhunting Committee to be UNSPORTSMANLIKE

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility for the **Art Young Award** is limited to members of the **NFAA** at the time taken. There shall be no geographical restrictions, either as to the residence of the claimant, or to the location in which the game is secured.

AWARDS: **Art Young Big Game Pin** and a **NFAA Big Game Patch** shall be given for the first example of each species taken with the bow & arrow according to NFAA rules, for a processing fee.

NFAA FAIR CHASE RULES: Any animal taken under any of the following circumstances should not be considered for an **NFAA Art Young Big Game Award**: "Yarded" in deep snow; helpless in water; helpless on ice; helpless in trap, while confined behind fences, as on a game farm, etc., in defiance with game laws or out of season; "Jack Lighting" or shining at night; from power vehicle or power boat; any other method considered by the **NFAA** Bowhunting Committee as unsportsmanlike.

SUB-SPECIE: Allow sub-specie of deer including Whitetail, Mule, Blacktail, Sitka, Coues, and Fallow as different big game animals.

APPLICATION MUST BE PRESENTED WITHIN (1) ONE YEAR OF TAKING BIG GAME AND ACCOMPANIED BY \$5.00 PROCESSING FEE FOR EACH APPLICATION.
