Archers competing for the highest combined scores of the 3 state championship tournaments, this is the **final leg** of the competition for the chance to win the coveted 2019 **Shooter of the Year belt buckle**.

## Board of Directors Meeting

The IAA Board of Directors meeting was held July 7, 2019 at Scheels in Springfield.

Chairman Tim Eller was not in attendance so the meeting was called to order by the Director, Robert Rayhel at 1:06 P.M. Roll call of officers was taken with the following present; NFAA State Director, Robert Rayhel; Northern board Rick Knorr, Cassie Flood, and Randy Rutledge; Central board, Don Craig and Roger Nieders; Southern board Ron Whitlock and Judy McCutcheon-Adams. Tim Eller, Kathy Pindell, and Patrick Eller were absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed to the board members in advance. Ron Whitlock made a motion, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Roger Nieders to accept. Motion carried.

The financial statements were accepted by a motion from Ron Whitlock , 2<sup>nd</sup> by Rick Knorr. Motion carried.

Awards were discussed and patches for State Champions have been ordered from NFAA. The current supply of medals will be depleted by the end of the aggregates. The awards committee- Judy, Ron, Kathy, Patrick, and Don- will be meeting to select awards that will be presented beginning with State Indoor.

The IAA Convention will be held at the Golden Corral in Springfield again. The date was set for Sunday, November 3, 2020.

Ron Whitlock reported for Bowhunting & Conservation that no one turned in any applications for any awards. Information will be put in the bulletin again next year.

Constitution and RIC had no new reports.

Youth committee reported the NASP had a good tournament. Ron informed the board that the tires on the IAA trailer need replaced. The cost will come from the Youth Fund.

Membership and club: Robert Rayhel said he had been contacted by a shop that is interested in chartering with NFAA.

Tournament Committee: Judy McCutcheon-Adams reported Panther Creek has opted for State Field to include 28 field on Saturday and 14 hunter/14 animal on Sunday. Robert said the Great Lakes Outdoor Sectionals will be held in Wisconsin for the next 3 years, most likely moving to a different location in WI each year. Randy Rutledge spoke about a need for monitoring approaching lightning and the heat index during the outdoor shoots. A detector would cost about \$899 and the cost could be split with the ITA.

For State Target, it was discussed having all 60-50-40 yd distances the same, shooting 5 ends of 6 arrows at each. A motion was made by Don Craig, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ron Whitlock to shoot 6 arrows per end during the 40 yard round at the State Target Championships. Motion passed.

Director Robert Rayhel and the Board members discussed the NFAA agenda items.

Only one commercial shop in Illinois, Buckskin Legacy, belongs to the NFAA. To try to get more shops to join, Robert suggested the NFAA/IAA fee of \$105 be reduced to the same fee as clubs. A motion was made by Don Craig, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ron Whitlock to charge pro shops a fee of \$55. Motion passed.

Two bids were voted on for 2020 State Indoor, a bid by IAA to host at Springfield Archery and a bid by Sauk Valley. The bid by Sauk Valley Archers in Dixon was accepted. The tournament will be held March 7 & 8, 2020.

Don Craig made a motion, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ron Whitlock to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 3:35 PM.

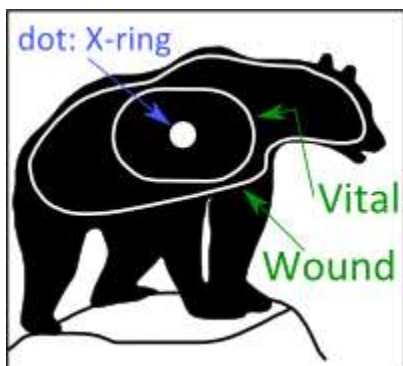

# HOW-TO: ANIMAL ROUND

## ***Animal Round***

The Animal Round is much like the 3D round, but the targets are 2D paper, that is, an animal image printed on a sheet of paper that is usually pasted to cardboard. Similar to a Field Round, distances are marked to give everyone an equal chance.

**Shooting Rules:** Scoring is a bit different on this round. You take three of your arrows and mark them 1, 2, and 3. When you get to the farthest shooting stake you shoot arrow number 1. If you hit the scoring area you need not shoot another arrow. If you miss the first shot you move up to the next shooting stake and shoot number 2. If you hit the scoring zone there's no need to shoot number 3. If you missed number one and two, move up and shoot number three.

**Scoring:** The highest-scoring arrow will count. For each of the three possible scores for each arrow, you get the highest for hitting the "X-Ring", the middle for shooting the "Vital Area", and the lowest score for hitting the "Wound Area". Your #1 arrow will count 21, 20, or 18 points, #2 will count 17, 16, or 14 points, and #3 will count 13, 12, or 10 points.
