Competing for the highest combined scores of the 3 state championship tournaments, 43 archers were eligible for the title of 2019 Shooter of the Year after State Indoor. The field was reduced to 15 eligible shooters after Outdoor State Target at Sauk Valley Archers in July. The final leg of the competition on Aug. 24-25 was the State Field Championship at Panther Creek Bowhunters for the coveted belt buckle with 11 eligible archers. A glitch in the computer program temporarily awarded Christi Batsch with Shooter of the Year but she graciously and proudly conceded the title to her daughter who finished 2 points ahead of her.

Board of Directors Meeting

The IAA Board of Directors meeting was held August 24, 2019 at Panther Creek Bowhunters club at the conclusion of the day's shooting for State Field.

Chairman Tim Eller was not in attendance so the meeting was called to order by the Director, Robert Rayhel at 2:58 P.M. Roll call of officers was taken with the following present; NFAA State Director, Robert Rayhel; Northern board Rick Knorr and Cassie Flood; Central board, Don Craig and Kathy Pindell; Southern board Ron Whitlock and Judy McCutcheon-Adams. Randy Rutledge, Roger Nieders, and Patrick Eller were absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed to the board members in advance. Ron Whitlock made a motion, 2nd by Judy McCutcheon-Adams to accept. Motion carried.

The financial statements were accepted after discussion of Shooter of Year belt buckle expense and Director expenses for attending NFAA meeting.

Awards committee member Don Craig has samples of plaques coming. Aggregate patches were discussed.

The IAA Convention will be held at the Golden Corral in Springfield again. The date was set for Sunday, November 3, 2020.

Bowhunting & Conservation, Constitution and RIC had no new reports.

Youth- Robert Rayhel reported that the youth who are members of an organized archery program such as JOAD, Collegiate Archery, S3DA, 4-H, and NASP will receive a free NFAA and state membership for one year.

Membership and club retention- no new report.

Tournament Committee- NFAA will have Outdoor Sectionals use slight modifications to the Field, Hunter, & Animal Rounds in an effort to increase participation and ease the burden on host locations or potential host locations because of space and safety concerns. The modifications include:

- Each distance reduced to 3 arrows
- All walkups changed to Shoot all from the furthest prescribed distance
- All fans changed to- Shoot 3 arrows from one position
- 80 yd walkup removed (Field)
- 45 yd walkup removed (Field)-would be duplicate distance
- 70 yd walkup removed (Hunter)
- 64 yd walkup removed (Hunter)
- 59 yd walkup removed (Animal)
- 57 yd walkup removed (Animal)
- Animal round- modify the walkup and reduced point for a miss rule. If you miss, just reshoot from the same distance and take the current point reduction as is.
- Allow for shooting any face on a butt that has multiple faces.
- Cubs shoot their own stake other than on Hunter & Animal Round- they either shoot their own stake or the Hunter-Animal Stake- whichever is the least distance

Field-saves 17 stakes; Hunter-saves 12 stakes; Animal- saves 18 stakes

Would reduce ½ round from 14 to 12 and full round from 28 to 24

Would reduce total arrows shot from 56 on a ½ to 36, and 112 on a full to 72

Would reduce space needed to have a host range

Would reduce time spent on course in adverse weather

Would reduce time to complete the round presumably increasing participation. Avg 5 hr to approximate 3:15

Director Robert Rayhel and the Board members discussed further NFAA meeting items. Cassie Flood made a motion, 2nd by Don Craig to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 4:30 PM.
